I became acquainted with Frederick Bachman at the time our Regt was organized at Camp Chase Ohio. He was then a well man not complaining of any disease when at Pina Station in Alabama he became sick complaining of Rheumatic troubles later in the season when at Huntsville he had some kind of malarial disease had yellow jaundice. He was still sick when we were mustered out of service in the fall of 1865 -

Joseph T. Muller says

I have known above soldier since we became
comrades in same Co & Regt in February 1865
at Camp Chase near Columbus Ohio
Our service was principally in State of
Alabama near Huntsville, Comrade Boehrert
became quite unwell while we were at Pine
Station about 22 miles ^{west} East of Huntsville.
Complained of Rheumatic troubles in the
Spring about March or April. Afterward
while at Huntsville about August same year
he was down sick with what I was informed
was Yellow Jaundice. At the time of our
discharge he was still complaining and was
quite unwell. his disease appeared to be
Rheumatic and malarial troubles. He
has since discharge become quite hard of hearing
his ability to perform labor appears to be
