The board^{met} pursuant to the above order, present Captain
Thomas. J. Kelly, Lieut Joseph Donohue and Lieut
Granville McSherry.

On due examination, and from the best evidence at our disposal, the Board find that the articles below enumerated were abandoned by Lieut Luke Murrian Master 10th U.S. while on the march from Winchester Tenn to Stephenson, Ala, on or about Aug 18th 1863. The wagons in which the articles were contained

were broken down, and being rendered entirely useless,
he was unable to save any part of the property abandoned.

The undersigned recommends that Lieut. Mamm
be authorized to account for the articles as lost in trans-
-portation, and drop the same from his returns.

The following is a list of the articles abandoned

- Three hundred (300) pounds Bacon
- One hundred eighty eight (188) pounds Ham.
- Two (2) Barrels Flour
- One (1) Box Mixed Vegetables 140 pounds
- One (1) Box Soap 60 pounds
- Three (3) Bushels Salt
