

Dear Brother

September 25<sup>th</sup> 1859

This brings you the sad news of your poor Mother's death she departed from this life the eleventh<sup>day</sup> of this month after many sufferings in this poor old<sup>world</sup>. But I hope she is now at the right hand of god where her sufferings will be no more.

I should of written to you about her death before now But some of the party inform you of her death as soon as it happened so I concluded wait untill now thinking that there would be more composure. I now write to know what you think had better be done the end of the year is drawing near and I think it best for us to come to some conclusion so as to give legal notice of the sale I think it would be to our interest to have it as soon as possible I was over to see Horace this morning he says the estate is little in debt he thinks it would be best to have a sale as soon as he can gather all the crop in which he can do by the middle of november or before.

As soon as this letter comes to hand you will please answer it and let me know at what time you expect to come in and what you think had best be done. nothing can be done untill we hear from you
