

Addison June 14th 1868.

Esteemed Friend.

Your letter was received a week ago to day. Thought I would try and answer it as I am staying home from church. The Boy and Family have gone to day. There has been meetings since last Monday evening up East. every afternoon and eve and they are doing a good deal of good (hope they will continue to do so.) a man by the name of Burnham has been the speaker, a man that awakes the ideas of the People. ~~very~~ much wish S & R could have been here to attend the meetings but there is good meeting there if they will go to them.

we are having very pleasant weather now. for the last day or so it has been very warm. begins to be corn weather. we have made a little alteration in the looks of things since you went away. have put an addition on the old Barn of 15 feet. raised it last Thursday it was so late before he could get the carpenters. is not a going to do anything to the old cider mill this year. have got the corn field fenced over east where we broke, and have pulled a lot of stumps down west of the house in the meadow it makes it look better down there, our ^{well} is full of water now. it begins to be worth something to the Boy. Charles wife is not very smart. The rest are all able to be a stirring about. G has plenty of business for the old Horse this season. Jewet was here this morning

I had to attend to his wants and Prat sent word by him that he would be here by 3 o'clock that keeps one from church to day. was sorry it happened so you did not see Loney when you was in Mo. expect before this time you know what it is to stew Oil. Should like to stop in to the old Still-house some night just for fun. hope you will have a good time and enjoy life while you stay there. expect Sarah was glad to have you come back so there would be some one there from home with them. Lieve I feel as though if I could sleep once or twice across it would do me good as I got up at 4 o'clock this morning. please give my best respects to all of the folks.
