Henry said they grow worse every year, I should wonder if they failed up entirely yet. The Middleburg fair is this week. Mr Stems come out and got the children last week. George is going to move to Michigan next month, or expects to now.

Albert Brides has lost his old black horse, he was a running in the lot (as Paul was trying to catch him) he slipped and fell on a root and took a gash in his side six inches long, he lived two days. You wanted to know if Henry was going to take your colt, that is what he has said all the time, that he had bought him, I supposed that he had written as to you, or thought you knew that he intended to have him before this time.
