Camp near Atlanta
Sep 23rd/64

Dear Cousin

I have not
received but one letter
from you since I was
home and that was a
short time after I came
back I have written you
about three or four but
can get no answer I don't
know whether you write and
I don't get your letters
or whether you have got
mad at something and
won't write if you have
you can just get in a
good humor again so please

my health at present
is good and I hope these
few lines will find you
enjoying the same blessing
I have but little to write
you this time we are lying
in camp and aint doing
any thing and we get
but little news here but
what you get long before
we do we got the news
yester day of Sheridons
victory their was quite a
rejoicing here at that news
I think that the rebels are
getting some of the worst
blows that they ever got
I think it will not be
long till they will
be plant out and I am

sure that I dont
care how soon for
I long to see peace and
prosperity once more in
our country then we
can return home again
to enjoy what we have
been enduring so many
hardships and privations
for then there will be
great joy all over the land
but alas there will be many
sad faces on that day for
there will be many brave
boys missing from our
ranks and to be accounted
for as lying on some
battlefield or at the
numerous hospital
graveyard in the south
