Claimant Frank M. Hallister was a private
and a corporal in Co. "B." 159 Regt O.V.I. & served
to galler & about the 1st of Aug 1864 at Gun Powder
River Mo. This claimant Hallister was sick & had
severe cold & cough & also malaria & was very
stupid & lay around his quarters. I & was a
wet norsey Goumy & we went to Baltimore in
a few days & This claimant continued sick
with malaria & his cough & throat trouble &
was very stupid & run down in flesh & he
was suffering with These Troubles when we
came home to be discharged & they was grow-
ing worse & in a few days from 4 to 7 days
after we got home he got very bad & was con-
fined to his room for several months with
malaria & Throat trouble & he became a skel-
eton almost & he never has received his
original strength & he has suffered more
or less in each year since our discharge
with This malaria & Throat trouble that he
contracted in the army & I have resided in
Zanesville O. ever since before the late war
of 1861-5 & I have seen claimant from daily
to weekly in each year since 1864 & I know
the above statements are true from personal
knowledge.
