Nov. 28-1900.

The Scientific faculty met in Prof. White's room at 12 o'clock on above date. Messrs White, Miller, Pence, Pryor, Mr. Kenzie, Kaste and Matthews being present.

The standing of a number of students was made the subject of discussion, in particular the cases of Mr. H. P. Bassett, Mr. Rippey, Mr. Swope, Miss Lyne and Miss Troy.

Mr. Swope's work in English and Mathematics; Miss Lyne's in English and Mathematics; and Miss Troy's in Mathematics being especially criticised.

The work of students coming from our accredited schools with the present relations of those schools to the college led to a motion by Prof. Miller seconded by Prof. Rastle "that this faculty recommend to the general faculty that the committee upon accredited schools be reinforced, since the withdrawal of Prof. Minney from active teaching by the addition of Prof's White and M^{rs} Kenzie to that committee. Carried.

Complaint was made of the habitual tardiness at first hour classes of Mr. O. M. Shedd, Miss Naive, Miss Whitfield and Miss Butler, and upon motion it was ordered that secretary should communicate these facts (regarding the first three mentioned) to the parents of these students and urge their cooperation in securing promptness in attendance upon classes.
