I, Margaret A. Bryan, of Jessamine
County, Kentucky, make and publish
this as my last will and Testament
revoking all others heretofore made,
After the payment of all my debts I
will, bequeath and devise all my
property of every description real
personal mixed and chosen in action
to my son Charles A. Headley,
but upon the following trusts;
He shall hold all of said property
in trust for the use ^{and} benefit of his
children both born ^{and} unborn and
for the issue of any children who
may die leaving issue and shall
manage same as to him seems best
and most advantageous and profit-
able for them. He shall have power
to dispose of and trade away any
of the personal property, (but not the
real estate) and apply the proceeds
or a sufficiency thereof to the support
of said family and invest the remain-
der in such personal property stocks
bonds or real estate as he may think
best and most profitable for said
children with power to change the
investment at will.
In order to promote his paternal

authority he is authorized to make
such advancement in life to any
child~~ren~~ or children and to devise
the estate by will on such terms and
in such proportions as to him may
seem just and proper. In the event
of the death of Charles H. before his
child or children become of age then
I appoint his wife Isabella M.
Headley Trustee in his room and stead
with like powers as those conferred
on him to terminate however on the
youngest child arriving at age of
twenty one years. Should Charles
wife die and he have no children or
descendants living, he shall then hold
the estate in trust for my legal heirs
at his death. Should he however
marry again or have descendants
then he is to hold the estate for them.
Should he leave no issue and his
wife survive him I devise one third
of the estate in fee to his wife and
the remainder to my legal heirs.
This property is for the benefit of the
family of Charles and in no event
is to be liable for his debts or be
incumbered by him and it is to be

held on these conditions for the
uses above set forth during his
natural life, And I do expressly
declare^{as} the controlling intent
of this trust the unrestricted man-
agement of the estate by said Charles
nor shall he be removed, or held
to account by any person or Court
whatever or for any cause whatever.
Having full confidence in him
(said Charles) I direct that no se-
curity be required of him as
executor or Trustee, nor shall any
inventory, appraisement or settlement
ever be required of him.

I hereby appoint him the executor
of this will this 14th day of March 1890,
