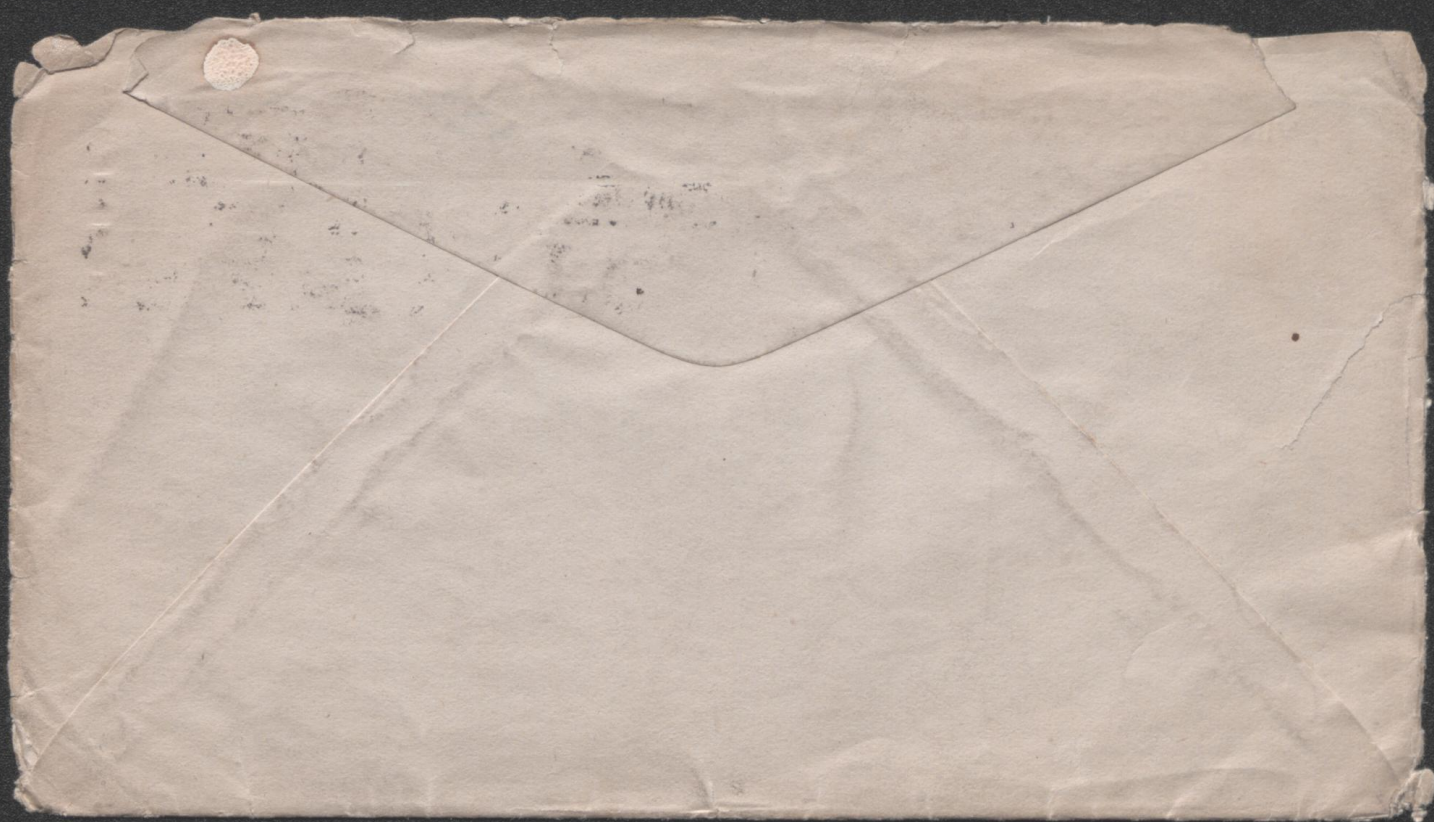

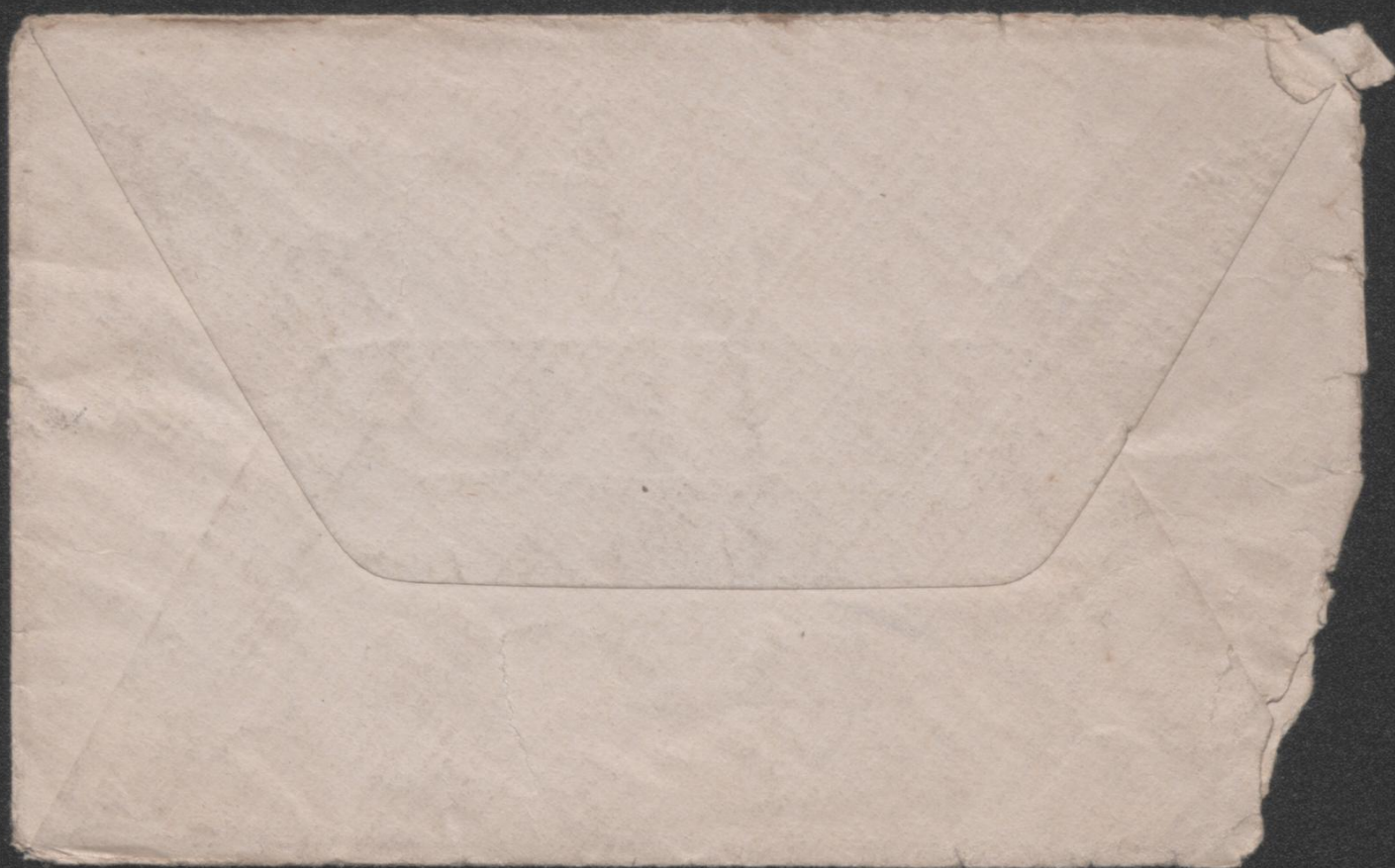
I am planning on going to Michigan in November but do not know just what time. I think about the middle of the month. I would like to be there next

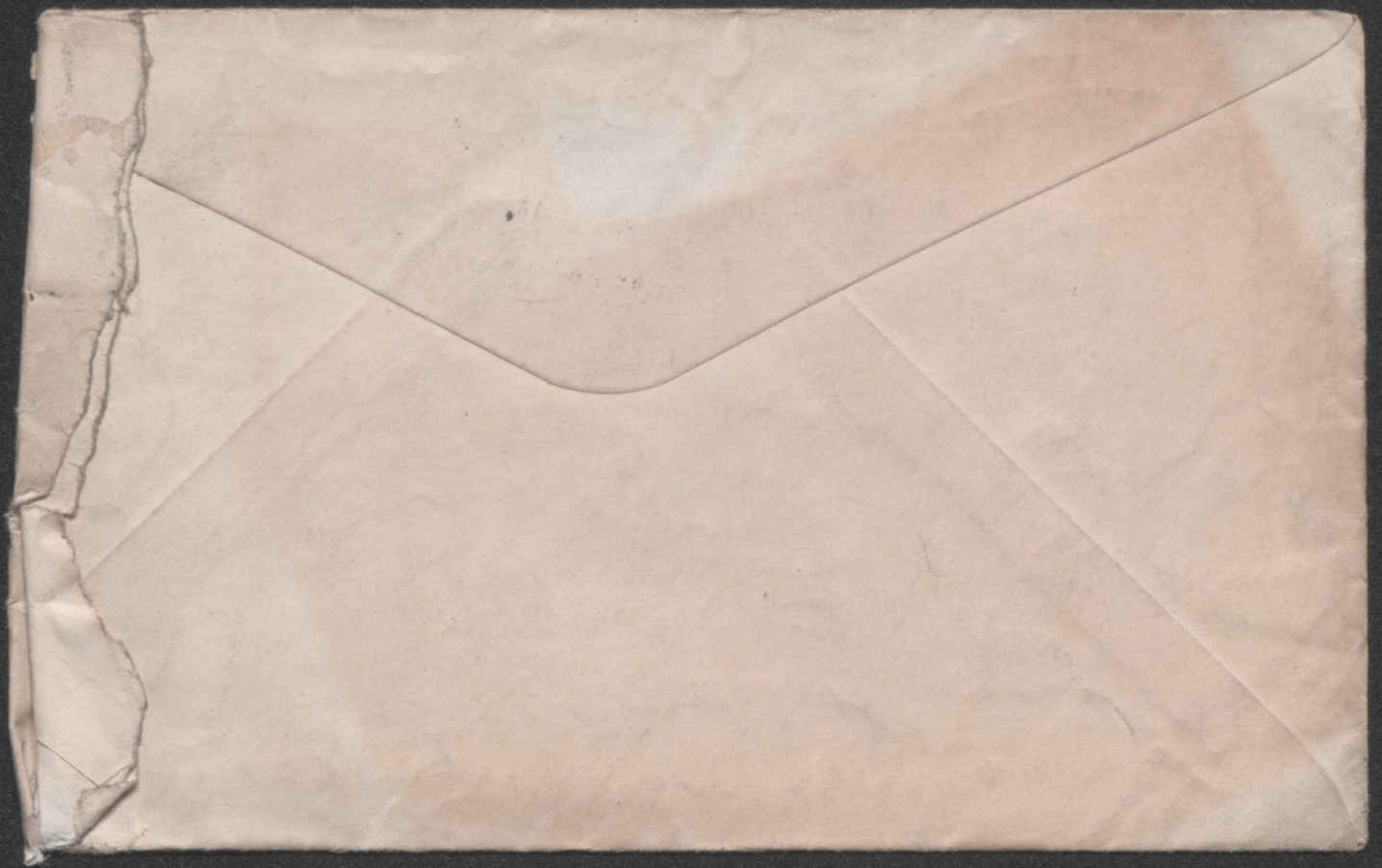
