Can't you and Berna come out this summer on your vacation. we would like to have you. When does your school let out Elvior let out Friday. shep did since we came down here

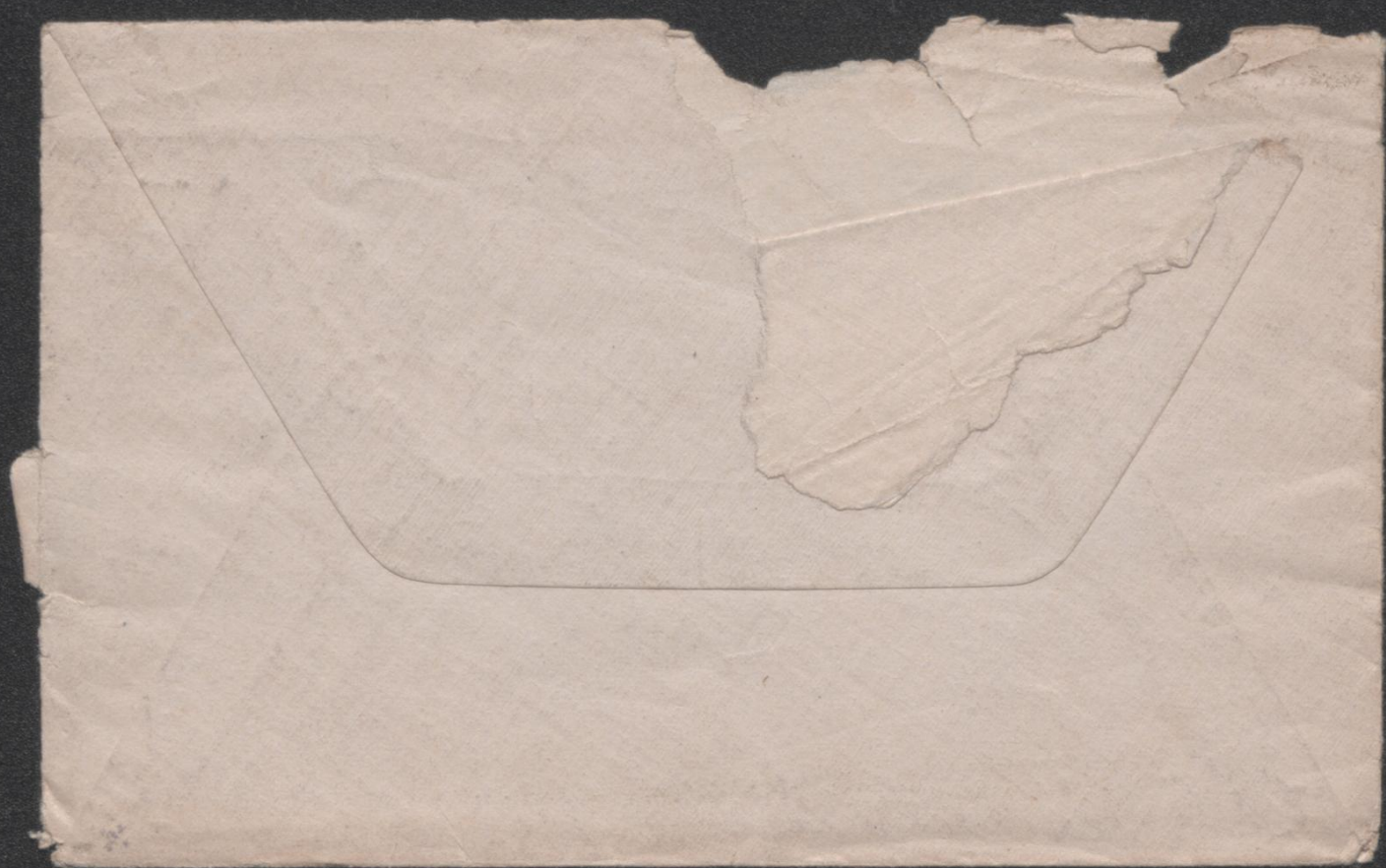

I am  (you know)

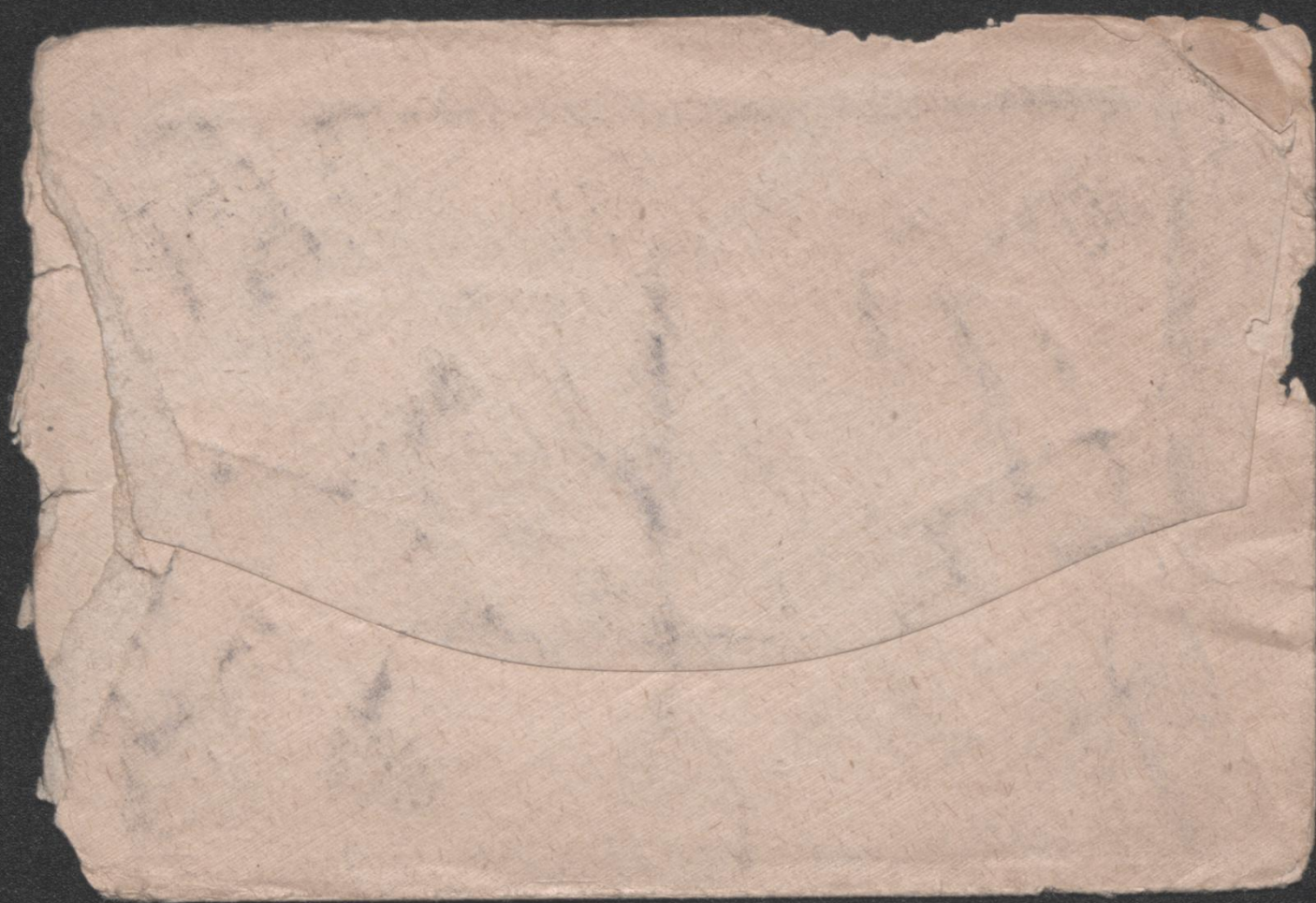
Am sending my best to all

Nov., 2-3, 1917.

Dear Mother:

It is nearly five o'clock in on day morning and first call is at 6:15, so I will have but a few minutes to write.

First of all you will notice from the postmark that I did not leave as I expected. There was another White here, a new man, and his name was on the list and two or three of the fellows here, seeing the name, thought I was going.

Four or five more details will leave here this week probably. The first one will include 14 men who will go to Ft. Clark, which is eight miles north of the border. They will be put in either field hospitals or ambulance companies, of which there are to be ten of the former

and eight of the latter. Twenty men will go with the 3rd. artillery to some camp in Alabama; three with a mortar battery; and twelve with a machine gun company. I don't expect to be on any of these as I understand the lists are all made out and I have not been placed on. I would like that trip to Alabama, but I guess I'm better off here.

I don't know whether I told you that I received the package you sent and also the box of candy. The chicken, cake, and all arrived in good condition, with the exception of the pears. The chicken was great but had to be eaten right away, as the day it arrived was very warm. I still have a little of the cake left and it is fresh yet. I keep it in my trunk and if I wake up during sleeping time I break off some.

I didn't go to bed Thanksgiving

as the whole night crew stayed up for the big dinner.

It was a regular banquet with the added pleasure of eating as much of everything as I liked and without expense to yours truly.

On the enclosed piece of paper is the menu and believe me everything was prepared fit for the finest St. Patrick's supper. I hardly knew what to eat the most of, but you will agree I ate all I wanted of turkey and both kinds of pie. Each of us got an apple, orange, and banana and I had two fine cigars. Those southern yams sure were good too.

For breakfast we had a sort of fried cake, coffee, bacon, ~~for~~ scrambled eggs, blackberry jam, flakes (with con-

condensed milk) and all the grapefruit we could eat. I don't know what they had for supper as I went to the Camp Travis - Kelly Field football game and did not get back for supper.

There were over 20,000 people at the game (and as many more on the hills who didn't have the price). Aero-

planes from Kelly Field flew from there to Camp Travis and did fancy stunts over the field and dropped the ball which was used. Gee!

It sure was a pretty sight and a good game. Travis won 13-7.

When we had our 10³⁰ lunch we had more turkey and pie and I had a quart of milk about 3 a.m. up in the ward.

The Saulists are having a mission this week and next at St. Mary's.

Nearly 6:15 so will have to stop here.

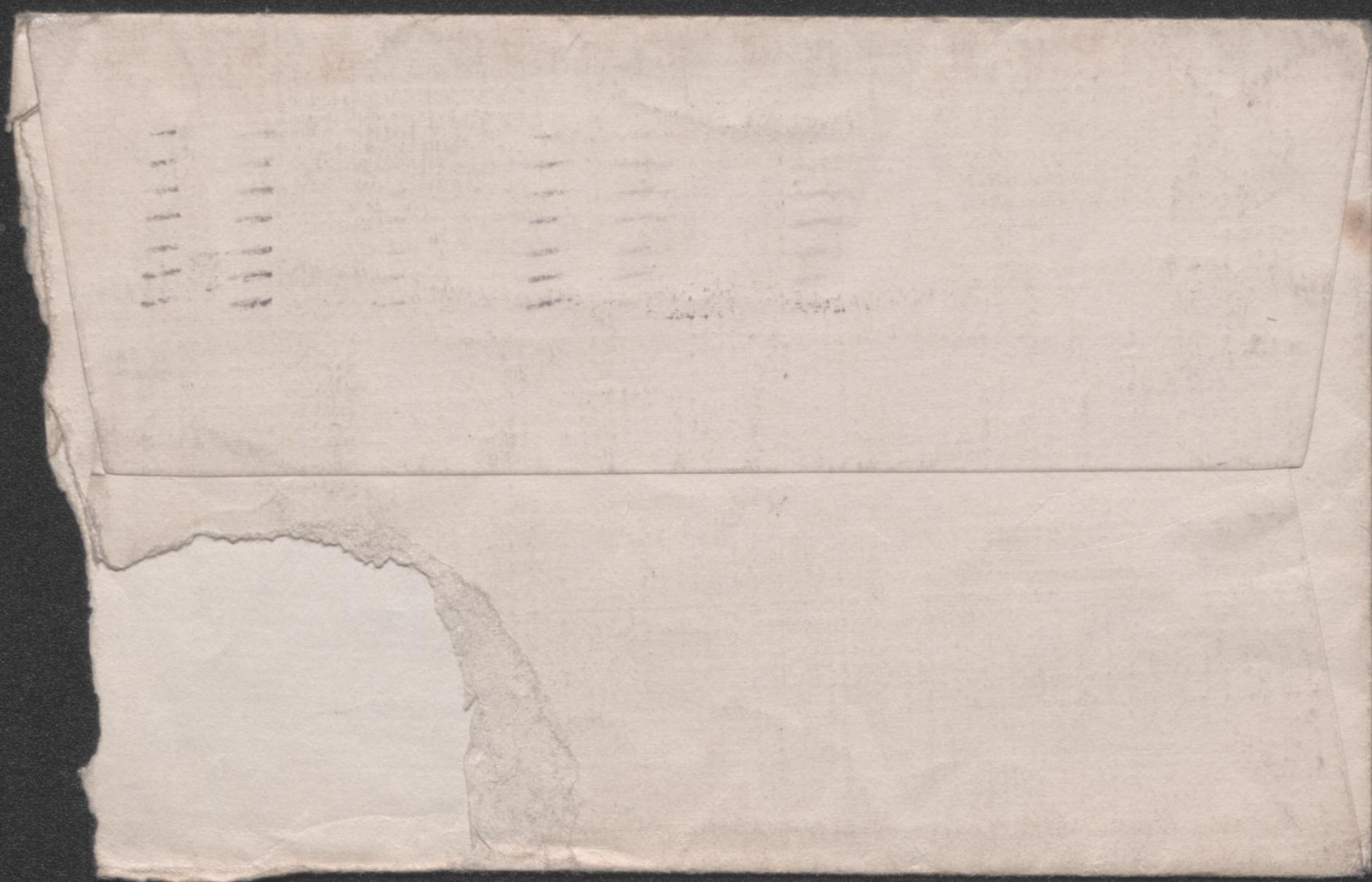
