High.

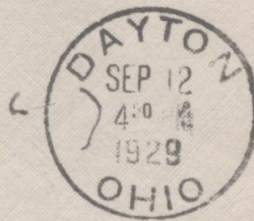
I will be sixteen this month.

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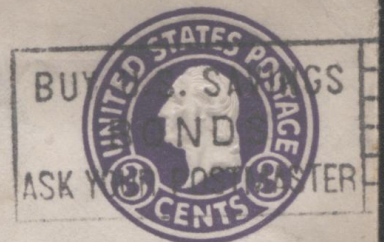

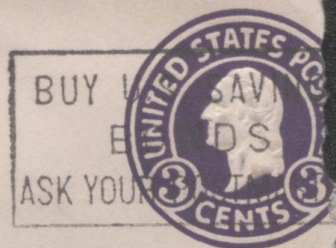
Friday morn.

jolt.

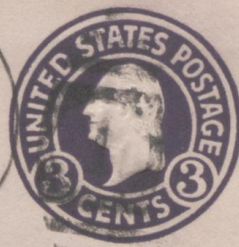
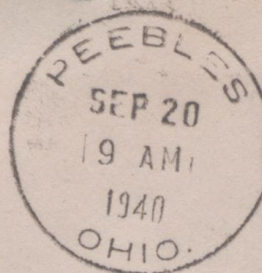
