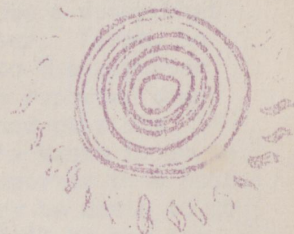
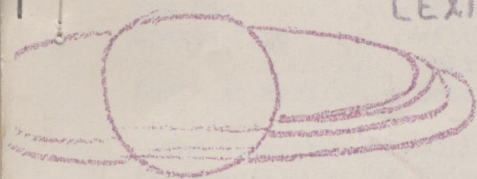

We have arrow heads that Indians used. We have shells from the ocean.

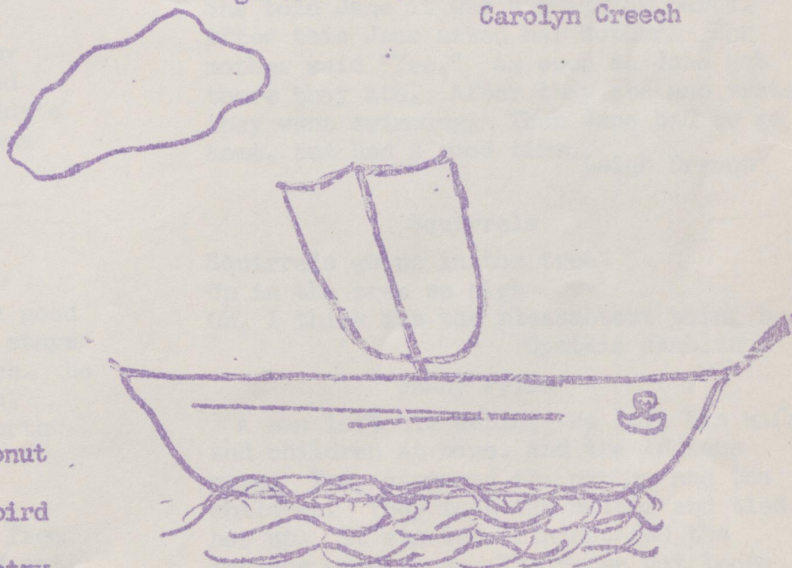
We have pretty rocks, ugly rocks, round rocks, and square rocks. We have some deer grass food.

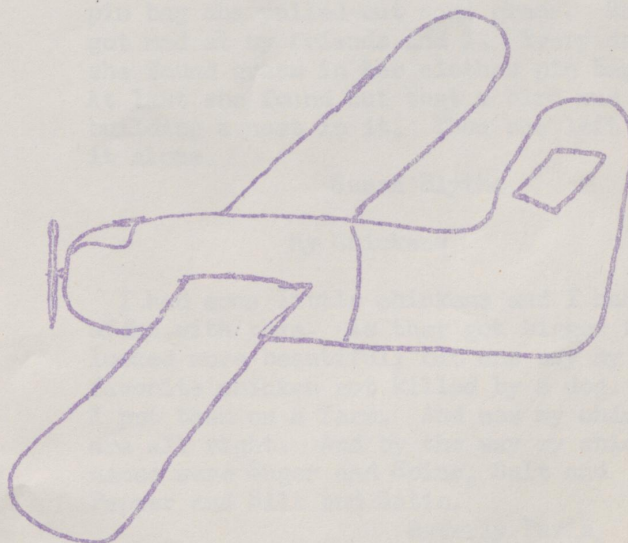
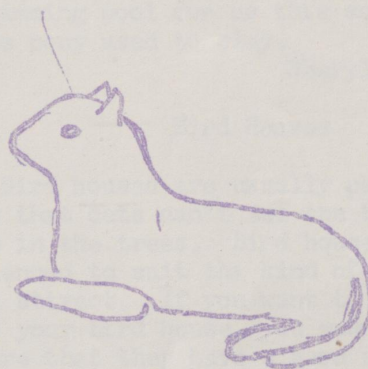

My Trip to Florida

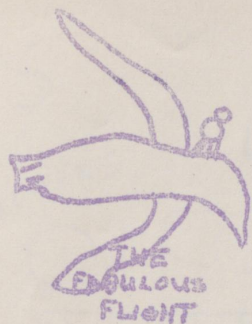
I went to Florida for two weeks with my mother and father.

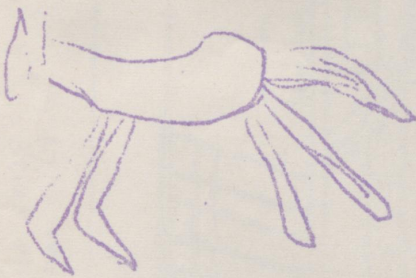
