Swope

Mr. Swope was reported as delinquent in German, Chemistry and English; Mr. Botts as doing very poorly in English and rather poorly in German.

Growing out of a discussion which seemed to reveal a general dissatisfaction with our present marking system, it was resolved upon motion of Prof. Miller that the general faculty be requested to appoint a committee to take the whole matter of student marking under consideration with a view to devising a new system which if approved by the faculty shall be presented to the Board of Trustees with the recommendation that it be substituted for the system now in use.

As revealed by the remarks leading up to the adoption of this resolution some of the things that would be appropriate for this Com. to consider would be;—

1. The relative merits of the quidecimal and centesimal systems
2. The grouping system versus the individual ranking system.
3. System of penalizing for absences and tardiness; adoption of some uniform rules for.
4. Frequency of submitting reports; at end of month or term.
