my resignation as Treasurer of Ky. Univ., I beg leave to submit the following
Report ~~of the State of my office, at this date.~~

I. Endowment Fund.

The amount collected of this fund remains the same, ^{as it was June 1, 1877, per} ~~as at the date of my~~
last report, June 12, 1877, namely; \$215,760 23. The uncollected portion
reported by the General Agent, June 1, 1874, was \$38254 08, the amount reported as collected since that date is \$416.85

II. Investments, ^{earnings and uncollected at this date} \$37840 23.

The amount invested in stocks and bonds in the hands of the Executive
Committee, ^{June 1, 1877, per} ~~at the date of my last report,~~ June 12, 1877, was \$132,486 66.
^{The mode of investment remains the same.}
Of the amount (\$25,000 or), collected in May last by D. A. Sayre & Co., of
the receiver of the Louisville, Cincinnati, and Lexington Rail Road, in payment
of twenty-five matured bonds of the Lexington and Frankfort Rail Road,
the sum of \$6628 was, with the consent of the late Executive Committee
and with the subsequent approval of the Board, retained by D. A. Sayre &
Co. in payment of their claim against the University, and the remainder
(\$18372 or) is now in the hands of the new Executive Committee for
investment.

III. Real Estate and Building Fund.

The indebtedness of this fund to the Endowment fund remains as
reported by me, June 12, 1877, namely, \$29,425 61.

IV. Apparatus fund.

The balance to the credit of this fund remains unchanged ^{since my}
last report, June 1, 1877, namely, \$2,238 98.

V. Prize Fund.

This fund was composed, Jan'y 1, 1871, of coupons given by E. D. Sayre,
F. K. Hunt, and Jas. C. Stone, to the nominal value of \$3000. No
addition has been made to this fund since that date. These coupons
have never been in my possession but have remained in the hands of
the former treasurer.

To meet this the University holds 324 matured Coupons, L. G. & L. R. Road.

The face value of these is \$11,340.00; their accrued interest to Sept 1, 1877 is \$963.90; a total of \$12,303.90; which deducted from \$39012.71 leaves \$26708.81, leaves the net ^{liabilities} indebtedness after exhausting the available resources.

If we add this amount (\$26,703 81) to the amount of the deficit in the Endowment and Apparatus Funds (\$63,421 36) we have a total of \$90,130 17. An addition of the corresponding items for June 1, 1877 (\$31,143 41 + \$56,793 36) will give a total of \$87,936 77; showing an increase from June 1, 1877 to September 11, 1877 of \$2,193 40.

By the amendment of the Charter, approved Feb'y 5, 1868, and accepted by the Board of Curators June 10, 1874, the Executive Committee are the ^{legal} custodians of their notes. They have never been in my possession and I am unable to say where they will be found.

I omitted to state in the proper place (~~paragraph~~ close of paragraph XII) that of the 324 Coupons mentioned in that paragraph, 108 are held by Professors in the College of Arts and the College of the Bible, to be credited on ~~their~~ ^{the} notes which they hold against the University for services rendered during the session of 1875-76; this credit to be entered when, upon the settlement of the affairs of the L. C. & L. R. Road, the cash value of these Coupons shall be determined.

By the 17th Section of the Charter, the Treasurer is required when he shall resign his office to "deliver up to the Executive Committee, or their order, all the books and papers pertaining to his office, and in each and every particular account for and pay over all money or other thing of value which may come into his hands as Treasurer." In conformity with this provision, I hereby place in your hands the books and papers pertaining to my office, except my vouchers and orders for money disbursed. There are in the possession of the Committee of Curators appointed by the Board in December last to investigate the financial condition of the University, and are held by them under the order of the Board appointing that Committee. Wherever they shall ^{have been} returned to me, I shall comply with the provisions of the Charter quoted above.

The cash in my hands (\$132.28) belonging to the University is on deposit at the Fayette National Bank, Lexington, as per certificate of its Cashier accompanying this. As this money lies under attachment I am unable, at present, to transfer it to the new Treasurer.
