The name of Mr. J. N. Harper was proposed by Mr. Mathews, as a candidate for the Masters degree. Owing to uncertainty as to the comparative rank of the course of study of the Miss.

J. N. Harper. Agricul. College (of which Mr. Harper is a graduate) and our own, it was agreed to defer action until fuller consideration could be given to the matter.
